	To quote a source:	
	1.	Identify the author, title, and the page or paragraph where the passage can be found.
	2.	Avoid unintentional plagiarism by using quotation marks.
	3.	Use ellipses, brackets, and sic as necessary.
	4.	Check your note against the original passage to be sure you aren't introducing errors or misrepresenting the source.
	To	o paraphrase a source:
	1.	Be sure that you understand the passage by reading it and the surrounding text carefully.
	2.	Restate the passage in your own words. Make sure that you do more than simply change key words.
	3.	Avoid unintentional plagiarism by comparing the original passage with your paraphrase. Make sure that you've conveyed the meaning of the passage but that the wording and sentence structure differ from those in the original passage.
	4.	Note the author, title, and the page or paragraph where the passage can be found.
	To	o summarize a source:
	1.	Be sure that you understand the source by reading it carefully.
	2.	Summarize main and key points in your own words. Make sure that you do more than string together a series of close paraphrases of key passages.
	3.	Check for unintentional plagiarism by comparing the original source with your summary.
	4.	Note the author, title, and, if you are summarizing only part of a source, the page or paragraphs where the information can be found.
